On November 29th, an energetic group of EMC folks gathered in the church narthex to renew dreams about our building and/or ministries, beginning a process to consider a capital campaign in the first half of 2017.

Those present brainstormed about the needs, opportunities and desires in our congregation and community. Our three response sheets were covered in stickie notes by the end of the night, and this is just the beginning!

Let me share a bit more about why and how we're starting this process. Capital campaigns are focused, time-limited drives to raise a large amount of money, generally in support of anticipated building remodels or construction. EMC has discussed a capital campaign for several years, but we've been waiting for the right timing. We've had dreams and visions about what's possible with our building, and we've also known about needed building repairs that are getting more expensive year after year. (That's why we're doing the current construction work; see below for an update on that.) Our leaders explored campaign options a year ago, and decided to wait until we had a new settled pastor. Knowing that EMC had the talent to explore a campaign and lead necessary repairs in the interim was one of the reasons I wanted to be that next pastor!

While Thom Miller, Sonja Martens, Jeff Strickler, Charlie Green and I have met as a preliminary "task force" over the last several months, we've learned that any successful campaign arises out of the church's vision for its future. Therefore, we must discern as the church how a capital campaign could help us raise the funds needed to better live out our draft Purpose Statement, which I wrote about

campaign-shaping process invites YOU to reflect on three questions: 1) How can we share more joy? 2) How can we offer a warmer welcome? and 3) How can we better serve?

The November 29th gathering was only the first way to hear from the congregation. Volunteers are now summarizing common themes among those first responses, and by Sunday you'll have more space on the boards in the narthex to share your thoughts. We also want to hear from homebound folks, youth, children and non-church members, so we'll have multiple ways to provide input. After several weeks of brainstorming and summarizing common themes, we'll begin prioritizing items by asking you to vote on your favorite possibilities. This will help us discern the most energizing and vital projects to plan for in a funding campaign. If all goes well, the church would vote early next year to authorize the campaign. Watch for more details as this process goes along, but for now I'd love to have you consider: What might be needed so that we can share more joy, offer a warmer welcome, and better serve the Morningside community for decades to come?


