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Behold! We are Doing New Things!

"Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?



I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43:19)

In last month's message I suggested that - in April - we, together, were writing the "Final Chapter" of our book titled "EMC Interim Ministry Time". However, the "Final Chapter" does not mean that I am finished as your Interim Pastor. I completed my one-year contract on April 30, 2016. The Church Cabinet and I have agreed to renew my contract on a month-to-month basis beginning May 1, 2016. This contract will extend until the Congregation has called a new settled Pastor and a date has been set for the beginning of their new ministry with you.

I also suggested last month that - in May - we, together, would begin writing a **sequel**. I have now titled that sequel: "**Behold**, **We are Doing New Things!**" I am taking this title from verse 19 of the 43<sup>rd</sup> chapter of the Book of Isaiah.

We reelected **Sonja Martens** as Moderator for 2016-2017. We elected **Jeff Strickler** as an Associate Moderator. (This is a new church officer position approved by the church Cabinet at their March meeting.) We received a report from the Board of Trustees that they had appointed *Mark Lorenzen* as a new volunteer Treasurer replacing *Cindy* Joyce. We will also be hiring a paid bookkeeper to assist Mark. We received the **2015 Annual Report.** Thanks to everyone (staff and volunteers) who served during the past year and for the excellent reports provided. If you have not had the opportunity to read these reports in April, I

#### A Vibrant Home

About 35 of our congregation recently enjoyed dinner and discussion surrounding our 2017 Capital Campaign.
Tom Johnson, church architect, joined us and presented his rationale for investing in church improvements. Tom's suggestions were originally

- beginning on May 20<sup>th</sup>.
- In anticipation of a new pastor, the Church Cabinet approved a new
   Pastoral Relations Committee. They will also have a May organizing meeting.
- The Moderator will be appointing an Ad Hoc Governance Committee to both review how to govern ourselves more efficiently in the future and to consider a possible re-write of the church constitution. This group will begin in May and will continue for as long as it takes maybe even a year or more. A change in church governance requires time for discernment and review by the full congregation.
- An Ad Hoc Personnel Committee will meet to begin reviewing staff job descriptions and updating personnel policies.
- We kicked off planning for a 2017
   Capital Appeal with a dinner on April 20<sup>th</sup>. The committee will be finalized in the coming weeks and months. The campaign is anticipated for February to April 2017.
- The Pastoral Search Committee has begun the selection process for a new settled Pastor. They will continue interviewing applicants in May and until such time as they arrive at a consensus candidate to bring to the Church Cabinet, who will then vote on whether or not to bring that candidate

given to the Trustees almost two years ago and provided a framework for our current planned improvements. His perspective on such improvements can be summed up this way-that instead of thinking about how we can improve the building for ourselves, we need to focus on improvements that will welcome the community around us. One of Tom's best phrases is that if we're not outward focused, we can love ourselves to death. If we don't reach out and bring others in, our church will slowly diminish and go away. 


