From Pastor Oby

It's hard for me to believe, but September 6th already marks my one-year anniversary as your pastor! It's been a heady and joyful ride. I'm excited by all that we've seen together over the last twelve months: worship vitality, building repairs, capital campaign, new members, tech enhancements, leadership transitions, weddings, funerals and baptisms. There's much that's new to look forward to in the coming twelve months also: Second Hour activities after worship each week, Divine Design renovations to the narthex and entrance, a monthly All Ministries meeting night (see below for more on that from moderator Jeff Strickler), and new confirmation plans. I'm thrilled to work with our staff and volunteer leaders as together we

learn what it's like to be the church anew in the 21st century.

Sunday, September 10th is Rally Sunday, when fall programs and Sunday school officially resume. That day in worship, we also begin a 9-month read through the arc of the Bible! Throughout the fall, we consider selections from Genesis and the Hebrew Prophets. I suspect we'll discover that these ancient stories and biblical characters are not so different from our own times. Then from Christmas to Easter we explore the life of Jesus through John's gospel, and we wrestle with the call of Christ in our lives. In the seven weeks between Easter and Pentecost, we follow the ancient church in transforming the world according to the calling of Christ. I hope you'll join me for the Second Hour after worship this Sunday (9/3) as we take a closer look at the arc of biblical experience in the Hebrew Scriptures. As we navigate everchanging times, we remain faithful by learning from the God whose ways and people are discovered in the pages of Scripture.

Finally, can I measure your interest in another possible new (old) effort? I love the Bible, and exploring it with folks who wonder about its connections to life in our own day. Would you be interested in joining a weekly or bi-weekly Bible study this coming year? I'm thinking about a Tuesday morning or midday meetup, with coffee or bring-your-own—lunch (with regret that this doesn't fit in the schedule for most working folks). Please tell me if you think this is too much newness right now, or if this would be a meaningful way to help you engage Scripture in future months. I'd enjoy leading the conversations and think they would help us all prepare for the coming

Faith Formation Update

Rallying Around Faith Formation



On September 10th, when church programs resume after a summer break, Edina Morningside will be rallying around a renewed commitment to Christian education. We continue to focus on teaching Bible stories, through *Shine*, to our students in grades K-5, whose class will meet most weeks. We will also continue to offer twice monthly classes for students in grades 6-8. The re:form curriculum will present them with the basics of Biblical and church history and theology over a 3-year cycle. I will be working with high school students once a month to apply Christian principles to problems in the world. The goal of the board of Christian education is to instill in students confidence in their faith tradition, including offering them opportunities to share and appreciate worship with their parents as they grow.

On Rally Sunday, parents may pick up a folder of faith formation materials applicable to their families. Folders will include calendars of Sunday school, confirmation, OWL, and special event dates, organized by grade levels for easy reference. They will also include sample curricula for children and


