try my hand at a weekly paragraph in our Friday Update newsletters in order to share my thoughts more regularly, and keep these monthly Messenger articles from getting too long.



Each week, I hope to reflect "through the lens of faith" on what's going on in the world or the church, as it relates to our purpose, "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving".

Like most of us, I've been surprised by the revelations concerning sexual misconduct in the workplace throughout our society. Well, "surprised" is the wrong word--I've suspected that women face far greater harassment in the workplace than I do as a man, but the confirmation of this is dismaying, to say the least. It's placed us as a society, as a church community, and as people of God in the uncomfortable but necessary position of discerning what behaviors are unseemly, unethical, and/or illegal. What the apostle Paul suggests about the freedom of Christian living (1 Corinthians 6) is instructive here, namely that even if something is lawful, it does not necessarily build up the body of Christ. Even when sexual misconduct does not violate the letter of the law, it can cause grave damage to the fabric of human community. As people of faith, we want to believe that people are redeemable; that past actions can be repented of, repaired, and forgiven. We also know that there must be meaningful consequences for misbehavior if we hope to create a world that better reflects God's realm on earth as in heaven Much of

#### In Our Prayers

We especially hold these members and friends in our prayers:

what we are seeing in the news today are the "chickens coming home to roost" after decades of men behaving badly, but being given a free pass because of sexism and the power of their positions. Our faithful response can be to believe those who are coming forward, call for reasonable investigation to determine truth, applaud when such findings result in corrective action, and work for the rebuilding of community standards (including reparations with offenders, where possible). As **Adrienne Maree has said** (of the Black Lives Matter movement), "things are not getting worse, they are getting uncovered. we must hold each other tight & continue to pull back the veil."

I've also wanted to check on our own church's policies and practices. Fortunately, your leaders worked on this just last year. In his final months, Pastor Howard and the EMC Cabinet crafted an anti-discrimination, anti-harassment policy, which was adopted in April 2016. Please read it here to see how it applies to you as a church member and volunteer. This week and next, I'm sharing the church's policy with our staff to make sure they understand their protections and responsibilities. Together, we will continue to create a church that is safe for all, sharing the joy of Christ's love in our words and actions.


