March Worship and Second Hour Preview

March 4th: For Family Sunday, we worship around a "Bread of Life" theme (John 6:25-40), hear from members about why church matters to us, and share communion as a church family. Second Hour after worship (all month) includes quiet meditation time in the sanctuary.

March 18th (7pm):

Please join us for a warm and centering Taizé-style worship service in the sanctuary. Our 30-minute, candlelit service of



meditative songs, scripture and silence is followed by a simple soup supper in the library. Please join in; all are welcome!

March 25th: Palm Sunday welcomes us into Holy Week with an all-ages procession to start worship, and we baptize Piper DeLong into Christian faith. Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem (John 12:12-27) creates a stark contrast to his crucifixion on Golgotha (John 19:16b-22). Today's Second Hour is the Women's Fellowship Bake Sale, followed by an afternoon retreat to finish the Spiritual CrossFit Lenten series.

March 29th: Maundy Thursday worship invites us to remember Jesus' service to his disciples at the Last Supper, and as he washed their feet (John 13:1-17). We observe the night of this great servant's betrayal and desertion.

March 30th: New this year, our Good Friday observance is a meditative time to contemplate the crucifixion of Christ. The sanctuary will be open from noon-3pm and you are invited to come for some/all of the time, with Scripture readings and musical reflections every half hour.

April 1st: **Easter Sunday**—Christ is risen—no foolin'! We celebrate with a 7am sunrise worship outdoors at Browndale Park, and with our festive
