I will be on summer break in June and July, walking with Santiago along the river and in the woods and across the prairies and behind the freeways and in the dog parks. Last summer's book project is on hiatus, but I'll be working on a



series of essays about those dog walks--and about living a counter-cultural life with God's peace at its center.

I am filled with gratitude for the year of wonderful faith formation memories we made together at EMC. Lisa Lally, Larry Williams and I just completed an Our Whole Lives curriculum with a cohort of five intelligent, curious, passionate, funny high-schoolers. Last year's Christmas pageant lingers in my mind as a fun, fulfilling, and beautiful testimony to the work of a loving and committed community: I hope that some of you are like I am and will be planning in July what Christmas music and stories you want to be a part of this December. We had a bang-up Mardi Gras Pancake Breakfast this winter, an Easter egg hunt joined the Advent Workshop as a community open house, and I was privileged to work with Oby in coteaching the confirmation class: all joyful events. For those of you who didn't get around to taking a Sacred Intuition class, I will be leaving some meditation samples outside the office for you to try out during the summer months; some participants experienced profound insight and emotional healing through their practice. It was an honor to be a part of that class, which was an outgrowth of the Spiritual Writing Group which continues to be excellently facilitated by Mary Rogers.

When I return in August, I'll be working to put together a simple faith formation program for our K-12 students: likely one that involves regular Sundays of children in worship and in a chapel setting where we learn about the Bible and the Christian faith through stories, yoga, art, games, and sharing meals. If you want to be a part of children's or youth programming in the fall, talk with Oby or the Vision Council this summer, or connect with me in August.

This, fall, I look forward to taking the initial class offering of the Damascus Project, which is an educational collaboration of the Minnesota and Wisconsin Conferences of the UCC. That class is about how to engage in theological reflection, and Oby and I are thinking about what opportunities for adult faith formation I can shepherd in the fall.

Until then, Santiago says "Woof!" and the keyboard goes, "Clickety-clack!" Enjoy the summer!

June 3rd: "There is a River"--worship led by Community Minister Rev. Frank Bennett, and music led by Charlie and Barb Green. Communion by distribution. Psalm 46 declares trust with utmost confidence in images of safe and glad cities fed by God's streams of help and mercy, the end of wars, and all nations celebrating together. This psalm of praise offers us a model for proclaiming God's reign this day!
