Through the Lens of Faith, by Pastor Oby

What's happening in the world and the church, as it relates to God's purpose for Edina Morningside Church: "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving".

Last Sunday morning as I entered the building, morning sunlight in the stairwell drew my attention to the painted glass window on the eastern side. Honestly, I'm quite often so preoccupied with thoughts of the day that I'm not paying attention to the beauty around me. That morning though, for the first time, I really stopped to notice (and take a picture of) this window. It shows a scene from the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37), where Jesus describes how an unlikely outsider caring for a victim of highway robbery exemplifies the command written at the top of the window, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Jesus finishes the parable and commentary on it with the command written below the Good Samaritan's image: "Go and do likewise."

With all the transformation afoot right now in the congregation, seeing that window was a helpful reminder that everything we do



is for the sake of loving our neighbors as ourselves. A remodeled entrance, gathering space and bathrooms will better serve our guests and members who have disabilities. (<u>See the images</u> <u>from last week's remodel presentation here.</u>) Streamlined governance proposals (draft <u>constitution</u> and <u>bylaws</u>) are



intended to free up time spent in meetings so there's more time for the "welcoming and serving" at the heart of our church's life. New possibilities for faith formation (watch for a survey soon!) will try to better reach every generation with the example and mission of Jesus Christ. These new efforts, alongside what we have done for years and decades, help fulfill the church's realization of Jesus' calling to love our neighbors as ourselves. So the next time you pass this window in the entry stairwell, remember that all of our comings and goings are opportunities to show love and service, to "go and do likewise".




From the Archives, by Church Historian Doug Fuerst
