

## **January Worship and Second Hour Preview**

January 6th: Follow the Christmas star to Bethlehem, journeying with the magi to honor the Christ child! We welcome guest musician Jim Lansing, hear the Epiphany story from Matthew 2:1-23, consider the gifts we bring to the community of Christ, and receive communion in the pews. Second Hour is a listening session (open to all) hosted by members of the Music Director Search Committee, to get feedback about our current and future music needs as a church.

**January 13th**: We mark **Jesus' baptism** (Matthew 3:1-17) by reflecting on what it means to be baptized and called "Beloved", like Jesus. We also celebrate the baptisms of baby William Eidsness and mother Kaylin Eidsness! Second Hour is our first Potluck and Ministries brunch, where we build community over a meal, and meet to coordinate the ministries of the church.



## EMC Coffee Co-op's: New in 2019!



Coffee Co-ops are a new way that Edina Morningside is enlisting church members and friends to share hospitality after worship each week. We are forming small-group Co-ops to coordinate one month of service together, and then for the rest of the year you can simply enjoy the hospitality of others. We hope participants find it to be reasonably light work, and a chance to get to know others better while taking turns doing a

bit of service for the rest of the church. If you are a member or friend who attends worship with some regularity, consider the month which we've arbitrarily assigned to you. Can you help out for some or all of the Sundays that month? If you'll be away from worship for much of the month, consider trading with someone else in another month. Please let us know in the office if you do trade, and mark the Sundays of your month on your calendar now!

- 1. There will be an **organizing meeting** of your Coffee Coop after worship on the last Sunday of the preceding month. There, you will get to know one another a bit better, figure out how you want to divide up the work, and take a tour of the kitchen and serving spaces.
- 2. Throughout your month, each week some will make/buy treats, set up Sunday coffee/snacks, serve, clean up after, or do a bit of each. We trust you to do what's possible for you, and we've tried to pair more experienced folks with relative newbies. Ideally, everyone in your Coop is helping out in some way each Sunday, but some may divide up the month so you have heavier responsibilities some Sundays and none on others.
- 3. On the second Sunday of most months we'll have a "Potluck and Ministries" meal downstairs in Fellowship Hall. There might also be other Sundays in your month that are special meals. For these Sundays, you would still care for coffee and arrange food on tables downstairs, but wouldn't need to provide food (unless you want to bring something for the potluck). Everyone attending will be asked to help with cleanup.

Get organized the Sunday beforehand, serve as part of your Co-op in your month, and enjoy the hospitality of others the rest of the year. Does that sound workable? As a church we can't make this mandatory, but we do believe it's a relatively easy way to care for one another (and something we're

asking new members to join also). Contact Coffee Co-op "chaplain" Mary Engelke with any questions. Thank you for being open to this invitation. Many hands working together will make the work lighter!

#### From the Archives...



Background on the two recently displayed pictures in the Gathering Space and Meeting Room:

"The Annunciation to the Shepherds" and "Women at the Sepulcher" are original expressionistic oil paintings by August Molder (1914-1982), an Artist in Residence at Augsburg College for 20+ years.

As a young freelance artist, August Molder acquired a talent which was to define his life's work, as part of a craft guild restoring church stained-glass windows in Estonia, where he was born in the early years of the 20th century. Molder was recognized in the artist community for his pioneer stained glass mosaic art technique, but his paintings are also prized by art collectors and institutions

throughout the United States. The paintings exhibit his trademark three-dimensional style.

The artist's religious-themed paintings and windows are often found displayed together in churches and schools throughout the Midwest, e.g.; Augsburg College in Minneapolis, St. Olaf College in Northfield, St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Red Wing, as well as other churches and schools throughout the country.

Early in 2019, Augsburg College will visit our church to certify the paintings as August Molder originals, and begin the process to catalogue both paintings in their inventory of Molder originals.
