Through the Lens of Faith, by Pastor Oby

What's happening in the world and the church, as it relates to God's purpose for Edina Morningside Church: "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving".

To nobody's surprise, this is the season for political messages. With less than two weeks to go before voters choose candidates for local and statewide offices, our



airwaves, mailboxes and phone screens ask us to align ourselves with one ideology or another. It can seem inescapable, even when some might hope to escape such "worldly concerns" in church. As your pastor, this is a challenging season to preach in because I feel called by God to reflect on the issues of the day, but fear that any mention of a public concern will be read through a partisan lens. This is a helpful time to recall that God is neither a Republican or a Democrat. Both party platforms and the candidates that adhere to them fall short of the ideals that Jesus espoused. At the same time, the policy choices of (would-be) decision-makers are also moral choices, revealing the deeply held values that pull on the levers of power. Jesus and the biblical prophets who preceded him speak at great length about the

faithful use of money, land, military might, and ruling authority. My challenge in preaching is to follow those examples, yet not slip into an ideology that puts a donkey or an elephant in the place of the cross. In a phrase, this is to be "political but not partisan".

Trying to be succinct, let me share how I try practice this. Here are some of the principles I use in deciding what to say and do in this realm:

- Weigh in on matters of public concern when needed, doing so from a position of moral persuasion rather than partisanship.
- Seek the "Kingdom of God" that Jesus also served, which he described as good news for the poor, release to captives, healing for the blind, and freedom for the oppressed (Luke 4:18).
- Be charitable and kind in disagreement, challenging faulty principles and policies rather the people behind them (who are children of God as I am, and neighbors I am called to love in Christ).
- Model--and call on others to practice--conducting our public discourse in ways that leave room for another to be right, for ourselves to learn anew, and for us to maintain civil community.

These are just a few principles, but they seem like the most important ones right now. I'm eager to hear you reflect also on what it means to be a Christian in these highly-charged times. Would you <u>let me know</u> how you're thinking about these matters also? Even (especially) if you disagree or think I've fallen short?

# **November Worship and Second Hour Preview**

**November 4th:** Just before Election Day, we consider the foreign general **Naaman's healing** by the Hebrew prophet Elisha (2 Kings 5:1-15), made possible by the actions of brave servants. What small actions do we take that make a great difference? We share communion in the pews and welcome guest musician Mikah Meyer. Our Second Hour at 11:30 focuses on the Christmas Program theme, music and scene ideas. **Remember to "fall back" after Daylight Savings Time!** 

**November 11th**: The prophet **Micah** (5:2-5; 6:6-8) guides us in discerning what God's covenant requires from humanity—justice, mercy, and humility. As our nation and communities seek to come together after another challenging election cycle, these biblical principles show the way forward. We also mark the 100th anniversary of Armistice Day, which ended World War I and restored peace. Our Second Hour is the delicious Meatloaf Luncheon!

**November 18th**: Worship invites us into the world of **Isaiah**, who told King Hezekiah to stand firm against an invading army and trust in God's ability to turn "swords into plowshares". Second Hour focuses on next steps in our affordable housing partnership with <u>Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative</u>.
