Through the Lens of Faith, by Pastor Oby

What's happening in the world and the church, as it relates to God's purpose for Edina Morningside Church: "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving".

In a partisan era when contemporary American society is so bitterly divided, anxious and heartbroken (more about that in Sunday's sermon), I pause to give thanks for these fine folks at the Tuesday morning Bible study this week, and the ten who gathered the night before as part of "Two English Teachers Read the Bible". I marvel



at the selfless curiosity and interest in community which brings members of the church and neighborhood together for these conversations. None of us is the expert--some just bring to bear more experience with texts or more experience with life. On Tuesday mornings we look at the Bible passage for the next

Sunday, and the "Two English Teachers" explore classic stories that we all (think we) know. Through laughter, storytelling and grace, each group connects ancient Scripture with current insights about contemporary life. I couldn't be more proud of these participants and leaders. Being among them is one of the most holy experiences of the week for me.

If you're looking for faithful exploration of what it means to be Christian today, charitable exchanges of insight and opinion, or conversation that goes deeper than the weather, I encourage you to come to one of these upcoming studies (every Tuesday morning at 10am, or the next evening one on 10/22 at 7pm, hosted by Jane and Larry Williams). I promise there will be room at the table for everyone who comes--even if we need a bigger table next time (praise God)!

October Worship and Second Hour Preview


October 7th: We hear God's covenanting with the people of Israel (Exodus 19:3-7; 20:1-17) through the Ten Commandments. What covenantal behavior shall we practice in our congregation, as we celebrate global connections on **World Communion Sunday**? We also receive the Neighbors in Need special mission offering and share in the Baked Potato Luncheon for Second Hour, hosted by Women's Fellowship.

October 14th: This year's **Blessing of the Animals** is in the sanctuary at our customary worship time. All well-behaved critters (or photos) are welcome for this shorter service, where we'll hear about God's covenant with all creation. We will praise God alongside every creature and every part of the cosmos mentioned in Psalm 148. After worship and Fellowship Time, all are invited to stay for an 11:30-1pm training on the new governance model.

October 21st: **King David** may have been the greatest Hebrew ruler, but in 2 Samuel we read of his greatest failing in the affair with Bathsheba and the killing of her husband Uriah. What might we learn from the prophet Nathan's risky truth-telling and the contrition of David that follows (Psalm 51)? The Second Hour presentation is by Laura Herman, introducing us to <u>myHealth</u>, which offers full-service, affordable health care for teens and young adults in the west metro.

October 28th: When God offers **King Solomon** anything he wishes (1 Kings 3), Solomon famously chooses wisdom rather than wealth, longevity or military prowess. Where is the covenant of divine wisdom to be found among public leaders in our own time? After worship, the Second Hour is a tour and exploration of the archives by church historian Doug Fuerst.

Neighbors in Need Offering



Neighbors in Need (NIN) is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the <u>Council for American Indian Ministry</u> (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in

Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice. This year, special consideration will be given to projects focusing on serving our immigrant neighbors and communities.

We will receive the NIN offering on Sunday, **October 7, 2018** as part of our World Communion Sunday observance. NIN contributions can be made online at any time <u>here</u>.

Beacon Update



Thank you to all who participated in the Beacon Congregation Convening Thursday night, Sept. 13th, at Colonial Church. We were a dedicated group of 15 EMC members among over 300 Beacon supporters! We sang, we clapped, we listened, and we learned. We heard the importance of home from someone who has recently moved from homelessness to stable housing through Beacon, we were asked to

commit to support Beacon's initiatives, and we secured commitments to support affordable housing and rental assistance from mayors and county commissioners. We were inspired, and we were energized!

During the fall we will have opportunities to learn more about Beacon's BOLD Campaign, to create:

- Three new housing developments (100 150 new homes with family supportive services) in 3 communities around the Twin Cities for families transitioning from homelessness.
- A dedicated public funding source for rental assistance.

We also have these New Learning Opportunities through the Beacon Academy:

- Power Surge: Plugging into Beacon actions and opportunities
- Ally Strategy: Building support with public officials and influencers

Through the **Beacon Academy** we will be able to strengthen more skills by attending workshops such as:

- Building Homes: What It Takes
- The Power of Telling Our Stories
- The 1–1 Visit: Building Relationships
- **Power Tools** (3 sessions: Power and Change, Building Relational Power, and Power in the Public Area)

For those of you who weren't able to attend *this* Convening do not despair! **Get out your calendars and save Tuesday, January 29, 2019 for the** *next* **Convening.** (Location to be announced.) The plan is to have a Convening with larger participation, *new* news about our progress, meet the new Governor and engage him in our plans! See you there!!
