September Worship Preview

September 2nd: We finish the "Ground Rules" series with guided conversations about how we might live out these Ground Rules going forward. We also enjoy "Amazing Grace" sung by neighbor Roman Cecchi, and share communion by intinction at the front of the church. No Second Hour.

September 9th: For **Rally Sunday**, we begin our fall programs and welcome back all those who have been traveling over the summer! Worship includes a celebration of the many ministries of Edina Morningside Church, and considers the covenant with Noah after the Great Flood. After worship, Second Hour is an ice cream social to encourage community (re)connection!

September 16th: This morning's **Daylight Celebration** combines worship and Second Hour into an extended experience of our mission partnership with Daylight School in Kenya. We'll relive some of the key moments shared by travelers this summer, eat the simple meal provided to students, and envision how we can deepen this partnership going forward. Karibu! [Welcome!]

September 23rd: Our exploration of the early Jewish scriptures this fall takes us today to the **story of Joseph**, imprisoned on false charges but accompanied by God throughout (Genesis 39:1-23). God's covenant with Joseph (and with us) is durable enough to withstand hard times.

September 30th: **God's liberation of the Hebrew people from Egypt** (Exodus 14) has become a cornerstone of Jewish and Christian theology, but it inspired doubt and despair by those who

believed it was impossible. We consider other times when we face daunting opposition, yet are paradoxically called to rest in God's promise of safekeeping.
