Through the Lens of Faith, by Pastor Oby

What's happening in the world and the church, as it relates to God's purpose for Edina Morningside Church: "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving".

This Sunday, we say farewell to our Faith Formation Director, Janet Anderson, and bless her for her next work at the Minnesota Conference of the United Church of Christ. Over the last four years, Janet has established deep relationships with our children, youth and adults; recruited and resourced Sunday school teachers each week; organized and preached for numerous Family Sunday services; helped create the Equipping Teens for Life conference with Peggy Orenstein that we offered in April 2017; arranged for numerous other "Morningside U" classes taught by church members for the community; led a Christmas program each year (including two that she fully scripted herself); co-taught two confirmation classes; assisted and co-taught several small-group adult education series; led Economic Justice meals to bring people and money to the North Side; and helped advance creation-justice and safer-church initiatives. This is in addition to her regular participation in faith formation work beyond our church (principally by serving on the board of the Resource Center for Churches), and her



"first love" of creative writing. We've tried a number of different Sunday morning models for faith formation,

honor of history, searching openness to new possibilities, and a deep passion for authentic spirituality which is received from tradition and reborn in new ways with each generation. I have marveled at Janet's skills and insights from our first conversations about having Joey Miller shoot a movie for the Christmas program in 2016, to her thoughtful care while preaching on Ash Wednesday earlier this month. I will greatly miss working with Janet, and seeing her sweet dog Santiago. I know that our children and families will miss her even more.

Even as Janet takes her leave from this role, and steps into full-time work with the Minnesota Conference, we hope to see her at Conference events and other activities in the future. We also have work to do as a church, discerning what sort of skills we will look for in our next Faith Formation Director, refining a job description, and recruiting our next successful candidate. Please let me know if you're interested in helping with any part of that effort--I expect that we'll start in earnest after Easter and continue into the summer. In the meantime, I hope you will join us in worship this Sunday to thank Janet for the ways she has offered her many gifts to us over these years, and to bless her for what lies ahead. God has been with us together, and God will continue to accompany us into the futures that we are invited to create, with the ever-fresh, ever-new Holy Spirit!



April Worship and Second Hour Preview

April 7th: For the **Fifth Week in Lent**, we consider Jesus' parable about sheep and goats (Matthew 25:31-46). What really matters in life—as Jesus and *The Book of Joy* emphasize—is showing compassion and generosity. We share communion in the pews, and Second Hour

April 14th: Palm Sunday--see below. Our Second Hour is the Women's Fellowship Bake Sale and Cookie Walk downstairs in Fellowship Hall.

April 18th (7pm): Maundy Thursday and April 19th (1pm): Good Friday--see below.

April 21st: Easter Sunday—see below. No Second Hour.

April 28th: On the **Second Sunday in Easter** we recall how the risen Christ meets the first disciples in Galilee, commissions us for worldwide service, and promises to be with us "to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:16-20). Rev. Frank Bennett leads worship.

Holy Week Worship

April 14th: Palm Sunday welcomes us into Holy Week with a palm procession and reminder of Jesus' public witness to God's reign of peace.



April 18th: **Maundy Thursday** worship at **7pm** invites us to remember Jesus' service to his disciples at the Last Supper (Matthew 26:17-30). With growing darkness and extinguishing lights, we observe the night of Christ's betrayal and desertion by his closest disciples.

April 19th: Our **Good Friday** worship is a meditative time to contemplate the crucifixion of Christ. The service will be in the sanctuary at **1pm**, with Scripture readings and musical reflections.

April 21st: **Easter Sunday**—Christ is risen! We celebrate with a **7am** sunrise worship outdoors at nearby Browndale Park (followed by breakfast at Perkins), and with our festive **10am** sanctuary service, complete with Easter lilies and special music.
