Through the Lens of Faith, by Pastor Oby

What's happening in the world and the church, as it relates to God's purpose for Edina Morningside Church: "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving".

I'm excited to share that our next Music Director for Edina Morningside Church will be Conie Borchardt, who has extensive experience leading congregational music with all ages, and brings a particular passion for all-church participation in worship music. Our current Director of Music and Liturgy Elaine Kirkland has shown phenomenal leadership these last few years, and has set us up well to carry the torch further upon her retirement June 2nd.

Over the past three months, our Music Director Search Committee has refined the job description, fielded interest from over a dozen applicants, then invited the Morningside Bells and Chancel Choir to give feedback



on three finalists. We were blessed with great candidates throughout, and the Vision Council unanimously approved Conie as our choice. I'm particularly grateful for the detailed, patient and faithful work of our Music Director Search Committee, led by chair Bob Beyerl, in bringing us to this exciting new development.

In her application materials and interviews, Conie Borchardt (sounds like "Connie" and rhymes with "orchard") emphasized her love of expansive faith expressions, including music and movement. Her guiding intention is to "facilitate connections to the Great Mystery by leading the community's song in lament and praise from the piano, organ, and voice in worship liturgy, the work of the people." Describing herself as a "Wandering HeARTist", Conie has most recently been the Music Director for almost nine years at St. Mary's Episcopal Church in St. Paul. Conie is also a regional leader in what's known as "paperless music", singing that creates harmony and melody through on-the-spot teaching rather than printed notes. When she's not leading congregational music, Conie is a Song Leader with Music that Makes Community, a Certified Dance Leader with Dances of Universal Peace, and a Full Voice Coach with Points of Light Music. She brings training in spiritual direction, passion for social justice, and experience as a person of mixed race to all that she does.

Having experienced firsthand Conie's talents in teaching and leading congregational song, I'm excited for EMC to start making music with her in the near future! Conie's first day will be June 1st, and her first worship service with us will be June 9th. Please plan now to welcome Conie to EMC on Pentecost Sunday!

May Worship and Second Hour Preview

May 5th: For the Third Sunday of Easter's fifty days, we begin a monthlong series, "Go Therefore," tracing how Christian disciples are sent out by the power of Christ's resurrection. The Scripture passage is from Acts 10, where Peter's vision prompts us to consider whom the Spirit makes "Acceptable to God" today. We also observe Holocaust Remembrance Sunday and share communion by intinction at the altar. Second Hour is a discussion for feedback on the draft Safer Church Policy.

May 12th: On the Fourth Sunday of Easter we meet the Apostle Paul, whose calling from God welcomes non-Jews into the Christian movement. "Bearing Witness in the Work", Paul calls us to recognize those who lead within communities of faith. We receive a special offering for Seminary Sunday, and welcome new members to the church. Our Second Hour is Potluck and Ministries, building community and coordinating ministries over potluck food in Fellowship Hall.

May 19th: For Liturgical Arts Sunday, we experience anew God's call for us to participate fully and freely in Easter's joy—this Sunday through imagery, movement, and the music of our choirs. "Unashamed and Gifted", we delight in the power of God manifesting from beyond and within us, leading us to shine unabashedly in the world. Our Second Hour is a congregational meeting to elect those who will lead the church's boards and committees for future years.

May 26th: This **Memorial Day** weekend, we "Go Therefore: Poured Out in Hope" according to the encouragement of Paul in Romans 5:1-11. We consider the challenges and trials that lead from suffering to endurance to character to hope. Where are we called to pour out hope for the sake of the world?

Taking Heart Open Houses



Ramadan is a month of the Islamic lunar calendar during which Muslims abstain from food and drink from sunrise to sunset; in 2019 it falls between the dates of May 6 – June 5. Fasting during Ramadan is one of the "five pillars" of



Islam, and is performed to learn compassion, self-restraint, and generosity.

Taking Heart Open Houses is a long-running program coordinated by the Minnesota Council of Churches (MCC) and the Muslim American Society of Minnesota (MAS-MN) to bring Christians and members of other faith communities together with Muslims for food and conversation during Ramadan. Minnesota mosques and Islamic community centers welcome their non-Muslim neighbors for a traditional Iftar meal at sunset, inviting a time of encounter and learning. Growing in popularity, Taking Heart saw more than 1100 non-Muslims attend Open House Iftar dinners in 2018. Dillery didn't spend any time in a labor or concentration camp, but growing up Jewish in Paris, France was extremely difficult under Nazi occupation. Her mother died when Dillery was just 13, just a few years later her father was taken and never seen again. She credits her survival to "human angels" who helped teach her, pay rent, hide her and feed her.
