What's happening in the world and the church, as it relates to God's purpose for Edina Morningside Church: "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving".

June brought the tremendous and joy energy of Morningside Theatre campers back to the rooms, hallways, patios and sidewalks of Edina Morningside Church! Now in its tenth year, Morningside Theatre Company has grown to offer four camps this year to three different age groups. Two of the co-founders (Jim Lansing and Jane Williams) are still leading it this year: Jim is in his final season, but Jane will continue overseeing the ministry in her role as our Creative Arts Director. I've had the delight of spending more time with youth and their families this year, taking breaks with them, teaching card games, and learning their names. Children, youth and staff of the church



have been part of all the productions this year, but this outreach ministry reaches families far into the neighborhood and beyond.

In addition to the sheer delight of making theatre magic together, I've noticed all the life lessons taught in the process of preparing a production. Even this week's camp for the youngest kids include youth leaders who were in earlier productions, and those youth who have aged out are coming back to work roles behind-the-scenes. This ministry is a significant investment of our building, staff and time resources, and it's one of the most successful ways of connecting with children and families around us. ## **July Worship Preview**

**During July, our Sundays move to Wednesdays—and outdoors!** Please note that we will not have Sunday sanctuary worship in July until the very end of the month, and instead will gather outdoors (weather permitting) on Wednesday evenings for community time and treats at 6:15, then worship at 6:45pm. ## **Conversion Therapy is Dangerous**



On June 16th, Jesus Lucero gave a very interesting and information filled 2<sup>nd</sup> Hour presentation about OutFront Minnesota. One of the things he talked about was eliminating Conversion Therapy in Minnesota and how we came within one vote of making that a reality in our state this session. There is an on-line petition that each of us can sign to let our legislators know that we oppose Conversion Therapy and want it outlawed in Minnesota.

#### (From the website as an FYI) Conversion Therapy Is Dangerous

"Conversion therapy," often referred to as "reparative therapy," "ex-gay therapy," or "sexual orientation change efforts," includes a range of dangerous and discredited practices aimed at changing a person's sexual orientation, or efforts to change a person's gender identity or expression. These harmful practices are based on the false claim that being Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, or Queer (LGBTQ) is a mental illness that should be cured. The United Nations has even gone so far as to classify these practices as torture. Unfortunately, many LGBTQ Minnesotans are still coerced and subjected to these harmful practices, which put them at risk for serious harms such as depression, substance abuse, and suicide. We have the chance to end it.

There is a request for a lot of personal information on the petition site that will be used for data collection and to acquaint the legislator with their constituents. We will not get lots of emails from this organization. To sign the petition click here.
