#### September worsnip Preview

**September 1st**: On **Labor Day weekend**, we finish out our Biblical Wisdom series with Ecclesiastes 2:18-3:8, where the writer suggests "To everything there is a season". We pray for labor in its many forms and share communion by intinction at the front of the church.

September 8th: On Rally Sunday, we welcome back those who have been away this summer, resume Sunday school and fall programs, welcome our new Faith Formation Director Susan Weston, and celebrate with an Ice Cream Social after worship! Our year begins with the Garden of Eden creation story (Genesis 2:4b-25) and our theme—God Creates Connection: Earth and Humanity.



**September 15th**: God Creates Connection between doubt, hope, and those who carry both simultaneously, including **Sarah giving birth** to Isaac long after childbearing age (Genesis 18:1-15; 21:1-7). After worship, we resume our monthly **Potluck and Ministries** practice, sharing community, food, and ministry input around tables in Fellowship Hall.

**September 22nd**: God Creates Connection between humility and blessing in the story of Genesis 32:9-30, where **Jacob wrestles with God** in a sleepless night at a hinge point in his life. Our Second Hour is an intergenerational experience of **Building Home**, led in Fellowship Hall by members of the Beacon Core Team.

**September 29th**: As we start a few weeks focused on Channeling God's Love, we learn from the examples of **courageous rebels** like Hebrew midwives, Miriam and the daughter of Pharaoh who kept Moses alive (Exodus 1:8-2:10). During Second Hour, we learn the power and possibilities of paperless music from our Music Director Conie Borchardt.



## **Dakota Sacred Sites Tour on Sept 29th (Details Updated)**



Healing Minnesota Stories and the Minnesota Council of Churches have announced dates for open Dakota Sacred Site Tours. These tours visit sites in the Twin Cities that are sacred to the Dakota people. Participants will experientially learn about the land's importance throughout history in a way that facilitates healing. (Pastor Oby can share his experience of a tour last year.) There is no set cost for the tour. They take up a collection at the end and

participants are encouraged to consider a donation of \$45-\$75 per person. Tour participants meet at St Peter's Catholic Church in Mendota Heights and carpool/caravan from there to two additional spaces. In an effort to keep this tour as accessible as possible there is very minimal walking (the greatest distance being maybe 400 yards). Those who may have an issue standing for a moderate amount of time are encouraged to bring along a folding or camp style chair.

## **Daylight Service Trip News**

#### **Dear Interested Trip participants,**

We are so excited to send a team of folks to learn, live, and serve alongside Daylight School in Kenya in the summer of 2020! Watch this video to experience what a day at Daylight looks like. We will be learning about Kenyan culture, experiencing the education system in rural Kenya, helping teach English, learning about traditional Kenyan life, and seeing lots of amazing animals on safari. The trip application is attached and should be turned in by Sept 15th, 2019 along with a \$100 non-refundable deposit towards your trip.



#### Trip dates:

Right now it seems likely that we will have two trips in Summer 2020 from Minneapolis UCC churches. The 6 mandatory pre-trip trainings will be done together. We will discuss with the pastors which church will be going when, but we will do our best to put folks from the same church on the same trips. Likely one trip will be Mid June - late June and the second will be early July to mid July.

We will not know exact dates until Feb. or March of 2020. We try to fly Sat to Sat but flight costs can make this difficult. So please be prepared to leave on a Thurs or Fri and return a Monday or Tues if flights costs rise.

#### **Trip Cost:**

The trip cost due to flight costs in the summer is estimated at \$4000 per person based on \$1600 flight costs per person (which is what they were last year) but please warn that trip costs may rise if flight costs go up. Also please check with your insurance company about whether tropical vaccinations are covered in your plan. They can cost up to \$800 without insurance. \$2000 per person will be due in January 2020.

#### Trip Applications: Due Sept 15th, 2019.

Pastor Oby went to Daylight in 2018, as did a half-dozen others from EMC. They are great resources to answer questions about filling out the trip applications going forward!
