Through the Lens of Faith, by Pastor Oby

What's happening in the world and the church, as it relates to God's purpose for Edina Morningside Church: "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving".

Last night a group of us from Edina Morningside Church attended the fall Congregation Convening of Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative, which works with partners to finance, build and operate supportive housing in the Twin Cities. Clients of Beacon's housing are those who have the greatest difficulty finding



housing: homeless young adults, formerly incarcerated men, multigenerational families, and those who are among the poorest of our neighbors. This interfaith collaborative brings together people of deep religious commitment who believe God wants us to keep people from being homeless, no matter who they are or where they are on life's journey.

Beacon is justifiably proud of the nearly twenty housing communities they've created for thousands of families, and last night we celebrated more that are in the works. However, what I found most challenging, visionary and faithful from last night's event was the insight that it's far more efficient to subsidize housing costs for people who currently have homes, rather than try to build homes for them when they're evicted for not being able to pay the rent. We are at the beginning of a years-long campaign for a Minnesota version of "Section 8" housing, since under the current woefully-inadequate funding, only one in four people who qualify for subsidized housing are able to get it. (Imagine if only 1/4th of qualifying

recipients of food stamps were able to get them!) In order to secure a statewide response at a scale equal to the current housing crisis, people of faith will need to find our voices within a broad coalition calling for government to act in order to achieve affordable housing for all. This will invite us to continue not only directly serving meals with people who are homeless through "Families Moving Forward" and other initiatives, but also to call for state policies that support affordable housing.

It can feel more challenging to advocate for policy change rather than directly serving the person right in front of us, but I find it helpful to remember, as religious philosopher James K.A. Smith says, "Policy is how we love our neighbors, and purity [from politics] doesn't release us from the Great Commandment. The illusion of being nonpolitical is a luxury of privilege that only leaves the vulnerable exposed." I hope that we'll continue being the sort of church that cares both for those who need direct service now--and those who would be helpful more in the long term by policy changes that better reflect the love of God for all people. I'm glad we're a church with hearts big enough to embrace both kinds of needs with the grace and love of Christ!



October Worship Preview

October 6th: On **world Communion Sunday** we remember the vastness of our global Christian connections around the central ritual of the communion table. Communion features various types of bread from around the world, and the one cup of our common identity in Jesus Christ. We reflect on the Ten Commandments, as described in Deuteronomy 5:1-21 and 6:4-9, and also receive the Neighbors in Need special mission offering.

October 13th: Our Scripture focuses on Ruth, a foreigner who finds belonging among God's people and eventually becomes the grandmother to the great King David. We are a people of extravagant hospitality, and God works through unlikely "outsiders" to bless the whole community.

October 20th: This Sunday, we hear how David becomes king over all Israel. He brings the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem with song, making Jerusalem a place of worship (2 Samuel 5:1-5 and 6:1-5; Psalm 150). We are a people of authentic, joyful worship, which informs our community and witness to the world.

October 27th: Our scripture focus is 1 Kings 12:1-17, 25-29, the story of King David's grandson Rehoboam and the need for servant leadership. The kingdom of Israel is divided in his time because he fails to recognize that the privilege of power is to serve the needs of others.

This year, Edina Morningside Community Church will be holding classes in human sexuality for youth in grades ten, eleven, and twelve. Our Whole Lives is a comprehensive, secular





curriculum created by the Unitarian Universalist Association of Congregations and the United Church of Christ for use in congregations, schools, or other community settings. It provides accurate information in a framework designed to teach young people how to clarify their own values and engage their whole lives—emotionally, intellectually, spiritually, and physically—in making

Baked Potato Lunch




BAKED POTATO LUNCH is almost here! Next Sunday,

Here's a little more detail about what's vibrating around.

Chancel Choir - Been in rehearsal for just over a month now, getting to know the singers and the choir music, and refreshing my skills in running a weekly choir rehearsal. It's a great group of folks with a plethora of basses, skilled tenors, delightful altos and darling sopranos. Join us when you're able, Wednesdays at 7:30pm!



Morningside Bells - Just finished our third rehearsal together this week (Wednesdays at 6:15pm) and settling into our groove of new and experienced ringers. We're looking forward to ringing in worship at the end of October.

The Moeller Organ - Two years ago EMC made a commitment to repair and improve the organ. Earlier this month I started my communications with our contractor, Grandall and Engen, getting to know the specs the church had agreed to, and tending to a unplanned repair that silenced the organ. I'm happy to say the organ is singing again with a temporary fix and my review of the contract shows your care to update the instrument with good

people. Immediately after the holidays, the organ will be removed and some basic changes will happen with chancel pews to accommodate the organ when it returns in March.

From the Archives...



This week the original Morningside Congregational Church, the Old Chapel, at 4003 Morningside Road (Scott Terrace and Morningside Road) was sold to a developer and is scheduled for demolition in the coming weeks. The owner Darlene Brown has lived in the old chapel with her family since the early 1930's, after it was renovated for use by the church as a parsonage for the

families of Rev. Francis T. Price and Rev. Cecil L. Prior. Rev. Price served as Pastor of our church from 1924 – 1926, and Rev. Prior served as Pastor of our church from 1926 – 1931. A small field stone was recovered from the property that is reputed to have been kept by early church members as a memento from the original construction in 1909. The stone is currently in the church archives for further investigation.
