## Through the Lens of Faith, by Pastor Oby

What's happening in the world and the church, as it relates to God's purpose for Edina Morningside Church: "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving".

Merry Christmas!! As this season of celebration for the incarnation continues for twelve days, I hope you continue to enjoy the season in relaxing, joyful ways. We also look ahead at this "hinge time" of the year, anticipating new possibilities in 2020.



I've been looking ahead to Bible passages in the coming year, and I'm excited for some time with Jesus in the Gospel of Mark! Starting this Sunday and continuing until Easter, we read through most of Mark's gospel in worship. Mark is the earliest gospel written—perhaps twenty or thirty years after the resurrection—and it provides a key literary source for Luke and Matthew. The gospel proceeds at breakneck pace through the story of Jesus: Mark's preferred description for anything that happens is "immediately". Mark's Jesus keeps his identity as "Son of God" a secret, and he gives less explicit teaching in order to emphasize miracles. Mark's multiple endings reveal different perspectives on the resurrection—which we'll consider on Easter morning.

If you're a visual learner, watch a brief <u>overview of Mark's gospel</u> from The Bible Project. If you prefer to read it, you can get through the whole book in just an hour or two. Check it out now, and join us this Sunday as we start "immediately"!

## **January Worship and Second Hour Preview**

January 5th: On Epiphany Sunday, we continue along "The Way of Jesus" in Mark's gospel with examples of his healing authority (Mark 1:21-45). Sunday school resumes and we celebrate communion by intinction at the front of the sanctuary. Our Second Hour is our monthly (snack) Potluck and Ministry, sharing community, food, and ministry input around tables in Fellowship Hall.



**January 12th**: In the gospel story for the **First Sunday after Epiphany**, Jesus heals a paralytic man and eats with tax collectors, causing controversy (Mark 2:1-22). Bagel Bunch resumes for our middle- and high-school youth, and the Second Hour is a creative intergenerational activity led by Susan Weston in Fellowship Hall.

**January 19th (10am)**: **Martin Luther King, Jr. weekend** brings a perfect opportunity to celebrate the African American spiritual tradition. Our gospel passage from Mark 4:1-34 conveys the ways of faith in parables of the sower and of mustard seed. The Second Hour is a **Safer Church Training** for all church members and friends in Fellowship Hall.

**January 19th (7pm)**: We gather for a warm and centering **Taizé** worship in the sanctuary. This 30-minute, candlelit service of meditative songs, scripture and silence is followed by a simple soup supper in the Meeting Room.



**January 26th**: Worship considers the church's call in response to daunting homelessness and mental illness, inspired by the story of Jesus' healing of

the "Gerasene demoniac" (Mark 5:1-20). We'll convene a **congregational meeting** to vote on the proposed 2020 church budget. Second Hour is a **Taco Lunch fundraiser** for Families Moving Forward by Women's Fellowship!

#### Faith Formation: A Look Ahead to the New Year



**Sunday School** resumes January 5th. Children in Grades PreK - 5 meet downstairs in Fellowship Hall following the Time with Children in worship. On Communion Sundays (the first Sunday of each month), children will return to worship in time to celebrate communion with their families.

We will continue to follow the Narrative Lectionary, so families are exploring the same stories each week in both worship and Sunday School. Remember to pick up a children's bulletin to continue the conversations at home or in the car!

Volunteers are needed each week in order to meet the "two adults" guideline set in our Safer Church Policy. If you're willing to help a time or two, please <u>let Susan know!</u>



**Bagel Bunch for youth in Grades 6 - 12** meets on the 2nd & 4th Sundays of the month. The IRS makes it clear that for a contribution to be credited to the 2019 tax year, it must have been received on the church premises, or postmarked, no later than midnight on December 31st. Dropping it into the offering plate on Sunday, January 5, 2020 does NOT qualify. Also, Seniors over 70 1/2 years of age could consider taking advantage of tax benefits related to
