Through the Lens of Faith, by Pastor Oby

What's happening in the world and the church, as it relates to God's purpose for Edina Morningside Church: "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving".

Last night, fifteen of us from EMC gathered with over two hundred other Christians, Jews and Muslims for the latest Convening of <u>Beacon</u> <u>Interfaith Housing Collaborative</u>. The room heard from Beacon leaders and elected officials about efforts to increase housing dollars provided by the legislative bonding process in 2020, seek better funding for family support services, and launch a multi-year campaign for rent subsidy that would keep low-income Minnesotans in their own homes (rather than



moving into Beacon buildings after they become homeless). I was inspired by the stories of transformation, and proud of how our own members showed up to understand the issues, then commit to helping future initiatives. This is one of the ways we share the joy of Christ's love through service—not just in direct service but also in advocacy that transforms our state environment into something that more closely resembles the kingdom of God.

Such advocacy has challenged churches like ours in the past, with members trying to avoid controversy by staying silent on official actions or matters of public policy. I'm persuaded, however, that Christ calls the church to lift our voices in support of those who are poor, overlooked, or maligned—just as he did in his own ministry. We participate in Beacon, and promote active engagement in the electoral process through ISAIAH, because of our faith's calling "to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke" (Isaiah 58:6). Jesus showed this in his Parable of the Good Samaritan, demonstrating that "love of neighbor" looks like letting ourselves be interrupted by the harm that others face, and making personal efforts to ensure their healing. So please convey our thanks to those who went to the Convening last night, join with others from EMC next Thursday night for an ISAIAH training on how caucus participation can advance a shared Faith Agenda, and stay tuned for other ways to enact our prayer for God's reign of justice and love to be done "on earth as it is in heaven".

February Worship and Second Hour Preview

February 2nd: This Sunday's worship ("**Healing Power**") takes its inspiration from the healing of Jairus' daughter and a woman with a flow of blood (Mark 5:21-43). We receive communion in our pews, and the Second Hour is our monthly (snack) **Potluck and Ministries**, sharing community, food, and ministry input around tables in Fellowship Hall.

February 9th: For "**Shifting Power**" (Mark 6:1-29), we consider the death of John the Baptist, Jesus' rejection at Nazareth, and the commissioning of his disciples. How does the prophetic Good News of God's transformative love empower those who gather in Christ's name now?

February 16th (10am): This Sunday, we talk about "**Cleansing Power**" in Mark 7:1-23. We also celebrate the festive Carnival and Mardi Gras season in worship, with festive beads, masks and feather boas! After worship, continue downstairs to Fellowship Hall for a Pancake Breakfast fundraiser, benefitting this summer's mission trip to <u>Daylight School</u> in Kenya!





February 16th (7pm): We gather for a warm and centering **Taizé** worship in the sanctuary. This 30-minute, candlelit service of meditative songs, scripture and silence is followed by a simple soup supper in the Meeting Room.

February 23rd: **Transfiguration** marks the end of the Epiphany season and is a Family Sunday, so liturgy is led by our children and youth. Rev. Molly Cox preaches about Mark 8:27-9:8, where disciples confess Jesus' identity as the Messiah, mistake what's required to follow him, then follow Christ up a mountain and see him transfigured. Our Second Hour is a presentation by Edina author Rev. Angela Denker, on her book "<u>Red State Christians</u>".

February 26th (7pm): Join with our church family as we consider the paradoxical gifts of mortality on **Ash Wednesday**. Mark 9:30-37 is our text, as we enter the church season of Lent with somber song and the imposition of ashes.



Please continue to keep the people of Kenya, the staff and children at Daylight, and the dedicated people who support Daylight in your prayers. Thank you!




