Through the Lens of Faith, with Pastor Oby

What's happening in the world and the church, as it relates to God's purpose for Edina Morningside Church: "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving". Black lives will *never* be valued as equal, etc. This is where an open-ended faith can save our hope, and better serve those we love. We say in the United Church of Christ that "another world is possible", and we pray for God's realm to come "on earth as in heaven", so even "when we face for a moment the worst our kind can do, and shudder to know the taint in our own selves" (Denise Levertov, "<u>On the Mystery of the Incarnation</u>"), the destiny of creation is held in the care of God, far beyond our own human efforts and failures.

In this spirit of trusting resurrection in the face of crucifixion, the poet Ross Gay wrote the <u>following poem</u> after the police killing of Eric Garner in 2015. May it encourage you to persevere. The ways of death may seem more visible, but the ways of Divine Life are more enduring and guaranteed.

A Small Needful Fact

Is that Eric Garner worked for some time for the Parks and Rec. Horticultural Department, which means, perhaps, that with his very large hands, perhaps, in all likelihood, he put gently into the earth some plants which, most likely, some of them, in all likelihood, continue to grow, continue to do what such plants do, like house and feed small and necessary creatures, like being pleasant to touch and smell, like converting sunlight into food, like making it easier for us to breathe.

July Worship and Second Hour Preview



In July we continue our summer worship series, **Unraveled: Seeking God When Our Plans Fall Apart**. For your copy of an accompanying journal for reflection, and to see all the scriptures for the summer, please <u>email the church office</u>.

July 5th: Worship focuses on the story of Pharaoh's heart grows cold against the Hebrew minority in the land (Exodus 7:8-23), and yet how with God even **Hardened Hearts Unravel**. We'll observe the Independence Day weekend, and offer prayers for this country, in the midst of so much great change.

July 12th: We consider the heated rivalry between Jewish leaders like Saul and Christ-followers like Ananias. Saul is blinded by his prejudice and Ananias by his fear, but **Assumptions Unravel** in Acts 9:1-20. Our Second Hour is "Zoom and Ministries", where we gather in small groups to guide the hospitality, spirituality, outreach, and theatre ministries of the church.

July 19th: When Hebrew leaders are taken into exile for generations, the prophet Jeremiah (29:1-7) advises them of God's wish that they put down roots in this adopted, unfamiliar homeland. **Dreams Unravel** in the face of enduring hardship, and yet God's spirit may be found

July 26th: Jesus' conversation with a Samaritan woman at a well (John 4:1-29) demonstrates how **Shames Unravel** in the woman's willingness to claim her unusual family circumstances and encounter Jesus as an equal, plus Jesus' refusal to judge or humiliate her.

Rent is Due - Call to Action!

Wednesday, July 1st at 8:30am

All are invited to join Beacon next Wednesday, July 1, for our "Rent is Due: Day of Action." <u>Please click here</u> to register.



We are coming together because we know hundreds of thousands of our neighbors are juggling their finances to meet this month's rent. This housing instability crisis, intensified by COVID-19, hurts our communities, our kids, and will increase the homeless crisis we see in our parks and cities.

During this Day of Action, we will join together in a 30-minute update call at 8:30 a.m. and then all take collective action together by emailing or calling the legislature. **We are excited to announce that Rep. Michael Howard will be joining us for our update call.** Rep. Howard is the House author of Bring It Home, MN, our rent subsidy bill, and has been a champion negotiating for housing issues in the legislature.

There is a lot to do during our day of action because the Minnesota legislature hasn't accomplished much. We need to renew our effort to build support for the transformative Bring It Home, MN bill that would provide housing stability for all Minnesotans. But we still have to keep advocating for this past session's priorities, because the legislature failed again.

We're disappointed, sad, and angry that this past Saturday morning, June 20, the Minnesota legislature adjourned - AGAIN - without passing our essential housing bills. No money for emergency rental assistance that would keep thousands of families from being turned out on the street. No money for the construction of desperately-needed homes for people with the lowest incomes. No money for the Minnesotans in every legislative district who are struggling for a home.



Legislators also failed to reach agreement on long-overdue police and criminal justice reforms and that disagreement overflowed into all areas of their work, preventing essential priorities for home from passing.

It is more important than ever that we join together in action and demonstrate to the legislature we are not ceasing our advocacy. Join us next Wednesday to hear from Rep. Michael Howard and take action demanding the legislature pass this year's measures and start supporting the long term solution of Bring It Home, MN.
